Remembering Norman Myers, biodiversity pioneer

Norman's most powerful contribution was the promotion of the theory of *biodiversity hotspots*. Before the 1990s, subjective judgements, opportunism and chance were often the drivers in choosing protected locations. Norman's paper of 1988, in which he first used the term "hotspots" in forest conservation, showed these choices could be made far more methodical.

It provides key messages on the relevance of the World Heritage Convention, with recommendations to help decision-makers integrate specific wording on World Heritage into the framework to be adopted by the Convention for Biological Diversity (CBD) next October.


BIOPAMA and GOVERNANCE




BIOPAMA small technical grants, now open






9000 students studying conservation online via MOOC. Growth in commitment continues

Economic value of protected areas via mental health of visitors estimated at US \$6 trillion pa.

We evaluate methods to calculate the economic value of protected areas derived from the improved mental health of visitors. A conservative global estimate is US\$6 trillion p.a.

This is an order of magnitude greater than the global value of protected area tourism, and two to three orders greater than global aggregate protected area management agency budgets.
