Date and time: Saturday, April 8, 10 am-1 pm

In case of bad weather: Sunday, April 9, 10 am-1 pm

Where: From Alewife T stop: Walk North over Little River bridge, turn West at the Alewife Greenway sign, and walk to the end of the path.

Program description: Jake recently caught sight of an incredible array of wildlife during a walk in the reservation's stormwater wetlands, including a Merlin, blue jays, Canadian geese, mallards, an American black duck, blue herons, a red tailed hawk, and a coyote. Jake is highly responsive to all questions and loves to discuss the wildlife that reside at Alewife Reservation. This high school naturalist spends much time passing through these diverse ecological systems in Cambridge which make the urban wild a unique experience for families as well as adults.

What to bring: A water bottle and appropriate dress for the weather (including sturdy water/snow-proof footwear). This walk is free of cost.
